## RULES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

*A motion to adopt these rules will be made at the opening of the Annual Meeting. Amendments may be offered at this time and require a majority vote to adopt. The rules, as proposed or amended, require a two-thirds vote of those present and voting for adoption. To suspend a rule at a later time requires a two-thirds vote of those present and voting.*

1. **COMPOSITION.** The Annual Meeting is open to members of the League of Women Voters of Collin County (LWV-CC), their guests, and visitors.
2. **DEBATE.** Only LWV-CC members have the right to speak. Members may not speak twice to the same question so long as a member who has not spoken wishes to speak.
3. **MOTIONS.** Only LWV-CC members have the right to make a motion or second a motion. Motions from a committee do not need a second. The secretary or presiding officer may request that motions or amendments of substance be put in writing.
4. **VOTING.** Only LWV-CC members who are citizens of at least 18 years of age and in good standing may vote. A majority vote of those present and voting shall be required for adoption of any measure, except where the *Bylaws* specify otherwise (e.g., amendments to the *Bylaws*). Absentee or proxy voting shall not be permitted.
5. **PROPOSED PROGRAM.** A majority vote of the voting members present and voting at the Annual Meeting shall be required for the adoption of items in the recommended program. A two-thirds vote shall be required to adopt a not recommended item.
6. **QUORUM.** Those members in good standing, present and voting, shall constitute a quorum at all business meetings of the LWV-CC.
7. **RULES CHANGE.** These rules may be amended, rescinded, or suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting.
8. **PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE.** *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* (11th ed.) will control the general conduct of the meeting, except where superseded by the LWV-CC *Bylaws* or *Rules of the Annual Meeting*.

## SUMMARY OF MINUTES OF THE 2015 ANNUAL MEETING

**Date:** May 15, 2015, 11:43 a.m. – 12:55 p.m.

**Place:** Medical Center of Plano Auditorium, 4001 W. 15<sup>th</sup> St., Suite 315, Plano, TX 75093

**Attendance:** 32 members, 3 guests

**Call to Order:** President Janice Schieffer called the annual meeting to order after a presentation by guest speaker, Plano Mayor Harry LaRosiliere.

**Treasurer's Report and Proposed Budget:** Treasurer Sharon Goldgar presented the treasurer's report and moved to adopt the proposed operational and education fund budgets as printed in the *Annual Meeting Workbook 2015*. The motion passed.

**Proposed Amendments to Bylaws:** Bylaws Committee Chair Janet Imhoff read and explained the rationale for seven proposed amendments to the Bylaws, as printed in the *Annual Meeting Workbook 2015*. Elizabeth Erkel requested that we consider each proposed change individually. Imhoff moved the adoption of each proposed amendment, and each one passed with the exception of the proposed amendment to Article XI. A motion to amend the proposed amendment to Article XI failed, and subsequently the original motion failed as well, since it didn't get the two-thirds vote required to pass.

**Proposed Program:** Program Vice-President Mary Alice Garza explained the three items in the recommended changes as printed in the *Annual Meeting Workbook 2015*. She moved the adoption of each item separately, and each one passed, as follows:

- 1) Adopt position statement on Homelessness and Related Issues in Collin County
- 2) Continue action on Voter Education and Voter Service
- 3) Adopt new action on Observing Local Government.

**Election of Officers and Directors:** The slate of officers, directors and Nominating Committee chair detailed in the *Annual Meeting Workbook 2015* was elected after no further nominations were made from the floor. The following new officers and directors were installed by Past President Elizabeth Erkel:

**Special Awards:** A Lifetime Membership Certificate, signed by LWVUS President Elisabeth MacNamara, was presented to Meg Titus for 50 years of membership in the LWVUS.

The President's Award was given to Sharon Goldgar for her many years of keeping the League's financial records in impeccable order, overseeing membership records, maintaining distribution lists, sending out E-News and VOTER newsletters, tracking reservations and payments, greeting members and others at meetings, and always representing our League in a friendly, professional manner. She was given a small engraved pewter dish.

## **RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO LOCAL PROGRAM FOR 2016-2017**

In the League of Women Voters, program planning is the process of generating study ideas at the grass roots level and results in one or more studies or actions to be adopted at a League convention or annual meeting. The Board of Directors recommends that members of the LWV of Collin County: (a) modify the Get Out the Vote action program to work under the LWV-TX action plan, (b) continue the Know Your Government action program as part of the Observer Corps, and (c) adopt a study on Security of Voting in Collin County.

### **GET OUT THE VOTE (GOTV)** (Action adopted May 2014)

**Recommendation:** Modify to work under LWV-TX action program for 2016-2018 as follows:

- Continue presentations on Making Democracy Work and Talking about Voting as part of the LWV-CC Speakers Bureau.
- Collaborate with Junior League of Collin County (JLCC) and other organizations to improve voter turnout.
- Continue to distribute GOTV wallet cards at LWV-CC events and reprint as needed.
- Distribute current supplies of GOTV yard signs and action kits to members.

### **KNOW YOUR GOVERNMENT** (Action adopted May 2015)

**Recommendation:** Continue encouraging members to visit governmental meetings as part of the LWV-CC Observer Corps.

### **SECURITY OF VOTING IN COLLIN COUNTY** (Recommended Study)

**Focus:** A study to examine how voting systems work, the integrity of the system, and safeguards against tampering or altering vote-counting mechanisms. Voting systems include electronic voting, military and other absentee ballots, provisional ballots, and online voting.

**Scope:** Speak to Elections Administrator and the Ballot Board. Briefly describe how each voting system works and what security measures are taken. Some issues to consider for electronic voting:

- Who writes programs
- Background checks on staff
- Whether more than one person is involved in each step
- Independent testing of system
- Storage of system when not in use; integrity in transporting system
- Intrusion deterrent and detection

### ***Not Recommended for Study in 2016-17***

During the program planning process, members suggested the topic listed below for potential study.

#### **Proposed Study of Safety of Water Supply in Collin County**

**Focus:** Solicit information from water system managers and convene a panel of experts to address issues of concern to include some of the following: age and distribution system and determine needs for improvement or other concerns; how water purification system works and the method for delivery to the community. Consider the availability and cost of services for residents as well as age of distribution system. Ascertain services that are needed to intervene and prevent contamination by corrosion or contamination. Explore funding sources and their distribution. What kind of tests are done and how often. Other issues to consider: water source, purification process and location of plant including age and updates, information about distribution system to include what pipes are made of, age and how sensitive to corrosion as well as safety from introduction of intrusive substance.

**The Board of Directors recommends that this issue be addressed in a public information forum in 2016-2017, rather than a full study.**

### ***Recommended for Program Review***

#### **Review of current positions**

As time permits during the year, review the LWV-CC positions to determine if the position should be revised or reconsidered.

## **2015-16 PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

*Making Democracy Work* has been the objective of the League of Women Voters since its founding in 1920, when women won the right to vote. We've spent the past year spreading and living the message that democracy is not a spectator sport – it only works when everyone participates!

In addition to our well-respected issue forums, candidate forums and *Voters Guides*, our two action programs have put us into the community as informed and active participants in our government. Through the Get-Out-the-Vote (GOTV) action program, we have worked with a number of community organizations to improve voter turnout. The Know Your Government action program has featured our members as visible representatives of the public in local government meetings.

Our new Speakers Bureau, which facilitated many of our GOTV speaking engagements, also arranged presentations of *We Hold These Truths*, a readers theater production about the women's suffrage movement from 1848-1920. After kicking off our LWV membership program with the play in September, we took it to Houston in March for the LWV-Texas convention, where it got a standing ovation from LWV members around the state.

Then, in March, our annual Women's History Month luncheon celebrated Women in Politics, honoring six women, young and old, who dared to step into the Collin County political arena to run for city council, school board, county commissioner and Court of Appeals justice. Thanks to all LWV-CC members for helping to make democracy work this year!

## **2015-16 MEMBERSHIP REPORT**

Our membership stands at 70, including 60 primary members, 7 additional members (formerly called household members), and 3 life members. In May 2015 we recorded 72 members.

### **STUDY, CONSENSUS AND PROGRAM PLANNING**

LWV-CC participated in all state and national study/consensus programs as follows:

- Consensus meeting for LWVUS Constitutional Amendment study
- Public forum and consensus meeting for LWV-TX Payday and Auto Title Loans study
- Consensus meeting for LWVUS Money in Politics study

LWV-CC also participated in state, national and local program planning as follows:

- Submitted recommendation for state study on Interaction Education as It Relates to Violence/Crime.
- Submitted national program planning report supporting various proposals.
- Recommended local program studies, action and review as detailed in the *Recommended Changes to Local Program for 2016-2017*.

### **GET OUT THE VOTE (GOTV) ACTION PROGRAM - Janice Schieffer, Chair**

At the May 2014 annual meeting, LWV-CC members adopted an action program to work with other community organizations to increase voter turnout in elections in Collin County. The GOTV Committee developed materials and an action plan.

GOTV action was continued in 2015-2016 with the following activities:

- National Voter Registration Day events in downtown Plano and McKinney and at Highland Springs
- "Making Democracy Work" presentations to various organizations, as listed in the *2015-16 Voters Service Report*.
- Facebook posts about the proposed Texas Constitutional Amendments prior to the Nov. 3, 2015, election
- Distribution of GOTV yard signs, pins and voter information to members and other organizations.

### **KNOW YOUR GOVERNMENT ACTION PROGRAM (OBSERVER CORPS) – Donna Bening, Chair**

At the May 2015 annual meeting, LWV-CC members adopted an action program to encourage all members to learn about how local government works. This was implemented as part of the Observer Corps by providing a list of local government bodies, including when and where they meet, and encouraging individual members or teams to observe at least one such meeting. Brief reports of meetings were highlighted in VOTER emails.

A dozen members attended meetings during the year, many more than one meeting. Marybeth Bonczek attended the most, as a regular observer of the Collin County Commissioners Court. LWV-CC participated in an extensive experiment to port the website to a new LEW beta version and reported many issues. The new LEW project was discontinued by LWVUS in February 2016. The lwvcollin.org domain is registered with Domain Registry of America.

**Content:** A Speakers Bureau webpage was created to publicize LWV-CC's voter education offerings. An Observe Local Government webpage was created to inform the public about local government meetings. Online payment for the March Luncheon was developed by Jerry Schieffer. Webpages were kept up-to-date.

**Software:** The LWV-CC YouTube channel was used for a March luncheon slideshow, with a link from the website. PayPal was used to collect member dues and March Luncheon registration payments. SurveyMonkey was used to collect feedback about the March Luncheon. VolunteerSpot was used for volunteer signups throughout the year, including Voter Registration events, Candidate Forums, Gift Wrap fundraiser, and committees.
