Format

- Candidates should arrive at least 10 minutes prior to their session.
- All candidates will be seated in random order by office sought.
- Each candidate will have up to one minute for opening remarks, in the order seated.
- Written questions from the audience will be read, and each candidate for the office addressed will have up to one minute to respond. The speaking order of candidates will vary.
- Each candidate will have up to one minute for closing remarks, in the reverse order from opening remarks.
- Candidates may not address questions or remarks to other candidates.

Candidates

Only candidates are allowed to participate, and no substitute may stand in for a candidate at the forum, either to read a statement or to distribute candidate literature. Unopposed candidates may not be speakers at the forum, however they may be introduced.

The symbol ^ means that the candidate does not plan to attend or no response was received. All others plan to attend.
